

Heritage group buying RR station

The Nicholson Heritage Association is proud to announce it is in the process of purchasing the old Delaware Lackawanna & Western railroad station in Nicholson.

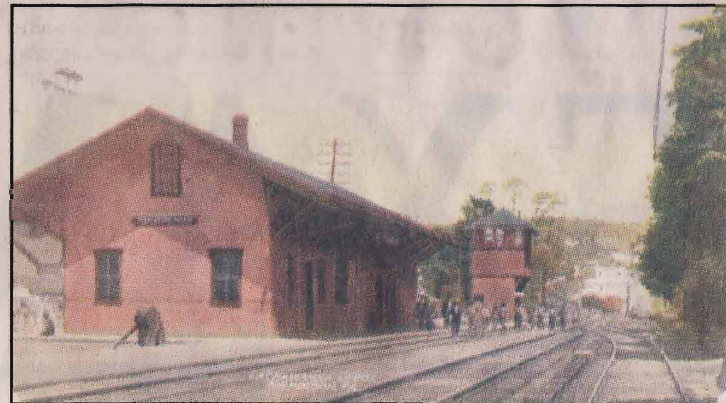
The station which is located on Route 11 was built in 1849, and the association hopes to have it as a central area of interest as the town prepares to celebrate the centennial of the Nicholson Bridge's construction in 2015.

The DL&W station was a freight and passenger station as well as a place to house and feed transient workers during its early years.

The post office was moved there in 1855 and the first telephone in the area was installed there connected to a line at a station in Scranton.

Members of the Association have met with the station owner as well as representatives from Preservation Pennsylvania and U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Development. We also are reaching out to the Northern Tier Regional Planning and Development Commission to let them know of our intention to acquire the station and garner technical and financial support within the community and region.
